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

2020 Legislative Session

SB01, Public Education Base Budget Amendments — appropriates \$12,961,700 for CE for FY22. This is a \$857,600 increase over last year.

HB 278, Name Change Process for Dixie State University — establishes a process for the Dixie State University Board of Trustees and Utah Board of Higher Education to select and recommend a new name for the institution to the Legislature.

HB 279, Higher Education for Incarcerated Youth — establishes a virtually-delivered CE program and accompanying advisory program at Dixie State University for students in certain custody situations.

SB 136, *Higher Education Scholarship Amendments* — replaces the Regents' Scholarship Program with the Opportunity Scholarship. It also extends opportunities for scholarships within technical education and forecloses new applications for the New Century Scholarship after this academic year.

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CE Grades

CE term grades recorded on the high school transcript and college transcript reflect students' level of performance for that term. The final course grade posted on the high school transcript and the college transcript must be the same.







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CE Grades

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
